RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Membership fee of \$30 entitles holder to admission for member and guest, members of family under 18 years, free parking, free entry for any section with prize money not exceeding \$5 (except Horse Events, Poultry Section and Section C Dog Show). Single membership \$15.
2. Admission to Showground on Show Day: Adults \$20; Children 18 - 10 years \$5; under 10 years free.
3. The Committee will provide facilities to exhibitors and all care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be taken by the Committee.
4. Competitors taking part in any Show competition do so at their own risk.
5. To ensure there is no danger from overcrowding, non-official persons (including competitors and animals not immediately engaged) are required to vacate the Paddock area.
6. The Committee reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving any reason therefore.
7. **The Harold Howard Pavilion will be open to exhibitors at 7.30am and closes at 8.30am. It will close at 4.00pm for Stewards to dismantle exhibits and will re-open at 4.30pm for collection of exhibits.**
8. **No exhibit may be removed from Showground before 4.30pm.**
9. In the event of only one entry in a class, the Judges may, if they consider it worthy, award a first and in the case of only two entries, the same may apply. On the other hand, they are empowered to withhold prizes.
10. The "Lockhart District" shall be interpreted to mean within a radius of 50km of Lockhart.
11. The Committee will not hold itself responsible for any errors or omissions in the Schedule. They are believed to be correct.
12. **CAMPING FEES:** \$10 per day plus \$10 per day for usage of power, minimum charge.
13. **GROUND RENT:** \$2 per foot or \$6.60 per metre. Minimum charge \$20 per day for usage of power.



YOUNG WOMAN OF THE YEAR

The Lockhart Young Woman of the Year will be considered an ambassador, representing both her community and the Agricultural Society, and will be eligible to compete in the zone finals of the Sydney Royal AgShows NSW Young Woman Competition. The purpose of the competition is to identify ambassadors to promote the Sydney Royal Easter Show, and Agricultural Shows across New South Wales. The program is designed to develop regional young women, to benefit the individual, the local show society, and their communities. Interview, presenting, and networking skills are all strengthened. This can create new life opportunities for participants.

Entry Requirements

1. The competition is open to those who are permanent residents of Australia, originally born and raised or presently living in the Lockhart District.
2. Entrants must be women aged from 18 years to 24 years as at 1 May 2026.
3. Entrants must reside, be educated, or work within N.S.W. for at least 3 months prior to the local show.

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

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

5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.

6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.

7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.

8. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.

9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.

10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.

INGREDIENTS: 250g sultanas 250 g chopped raisins 250 g currants 125 g chopped mixed peel 90 g chopped red glace cherries 90 g chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250 g plain flour 60 g self-raising flour 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves 250g butter 250g soft brown sugar ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind ½ teaspoon almond essence ½ teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs.

RECOMMENDED METHOD: • Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. • Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. • Sift together the flours and spices • Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. • Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. • Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin. **Note 1:** To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces. **Note 2:** The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)


